Campaign Blitzes in 2005

The Young Republican National Federation (YRNF) worked closely with state clubs to target several races for 2005 YR Campaign Blitzes. In particular, the YRNF set aside the weekends of October 15th, October 22nd and the 72 Hour Election weekend to campaign for GOP candidates for Governor, Doug Forrester of New Jersey and Jerry Kilgore of Virginia. YRs descended upon four states to engage in a strong campaign effort to ensure GOP victories on November 8th.

The New Jersey and Virginia weekends are just two of the many campaign swings that the YRs made this election cycle. YRs also organized campaign blitzes in New York for Mayor Mike Bloomberg and local candidates, and also in New Hampshire where 20 YRs were running for various offices. Half of the YRNF targeted races were victorious.

YRs from Connecticut, Indiana, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania and across the Commonwealth of Virginia, joined together on these designated campaign days to make close to 5,000 contacts with New Jersey and Virginia voters. By dropping literature and

At many of Sheehan's stops, Young Republicans (YRs) held counter-rallies all

while chanting, holding up flags and signs reading "Support Our Troops" and "Cindy, You Don't Speak for Me." Young Republicans made it clear that the most important thing Americans can do for our servicemen and women is support them as they fight for our daily freedoms.

YR National Voter Registration Day with Governor Huckabee

Young Republicans from coast to coast worked to register new voters on Saturday, August 27th. The day's events were kicked off in New Hampshire, where the granite state was the first in the nation by organizing an early morning meeting with Arkansas Governor Mike Huckabee.

A few hundred Young Republicans from Maine, Massachusetts, and New Hampshire met with Governor Huckabee in downtown Manchester

before joining Young Republican Registration efforts from across the country.

"Having Governor Huckabee support the efforts of the Young Republicans is a great honor. We had a great day of building our party and signing up new voters," said BJ Perry, Chairman of the New Hampshire Young Republicans. Perry, a Manchester resident, was tapped by

Missouri YRs Take on Hannity-North Concert

The Missouri Young Republicans recently conducted an outreach booth in conjunction with the Sean Hannity-Oliver North concert in St. Charles, MO. At the venue, Missouri Young Republicans were able to distribute thousands of pieces of YR literature, identify several hundred Republicans of all ages as active volunteers, and meet several potential new Young Republican leaders.

Working together with the St. Louis based conservative talk radio station 97.1 FM, the YRs were able to convey the message that Republicans can play an active role in Missouri politics, by joining the Missouri YR Organization.

"We were also able to meet people in our age group, from parts of the state that don't currently have a chartered YR group that want to get the ball rolling and get one started," commented Missouri Young Republican Chair Gus Wagner. "Our website visits have more than tripled, in the days after the concert, our internet joins have increased, and we even gained a bit of local media coverage in the St. Louis Post-Dispatch for our efforts."

"While the attendees were probably 99% strong Republicans, many mentioned to us that they had never been asked to join the Party or a Party group in an active way before," remarked Missouri Young Republican Co-Chair Monica Durrwachter. "We invited all of them to take part in our Young Republican activities regardless of their age, because

volunteers are the one thing we can never max out on."

"This was a fantastic event and I suggest that all local and state groups try similar approaches when a conservative concert like this comes to your area," John Heidbrink, President of the St. Charles County Young Republicans said. "This event brought more than 30 new members to our local group alone. What else could do that? I can't wait for the Glenn Beck Christmas show in December, to do this again!"

The Missouri Young Republicans currently have 17 local organizations with more than 2,000 members across the state. Young Republicans Out in Front on Fair Tax

Three weeks before Neal Boortz and John Linder released their book, *The Fairtax Book*, the Young Republican National Federation became the first national Republican organization to formally endorse the FairTax plan.

YR National Convention Resolution 5 "In support of the FairTax" stated:

WHEREAS: The current income tax system punishes the hard work and entrepreneurship, and

WHEREAS: The current tax code is over 100,000 pages long and costs American families and American businesses billions of dollars in compliance costs, and

WHEREAS: All of America's federal budget can be covered with the use of a federal national consumption tax, and

WHEREAS: The FairTax Bill would eliminate the income tax in favor of a national consumption tax allowing Americans to keep their full paycheck, and

WHEREAS: The FairTax legislation also would eliminate the

bloated and abusive agency known as the Internal Revenue Service, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED: That the Young Republican National Federation, in convention assembled in the City of Las Vegas and the State of Nevada, on this the Ninth day of July in the Year of Our Lord 2005, encourages the United States Congress to

pass the FairTax and the elimination of the IRS.

The FairTax, H.R. 25, would eliminate all current taxes on income and replace it with a simple 23% sales tax on all goods or services. Americans would not have to pay income tax, social security tax, estate tax, capital gains tax, death tax, etc.

Critics say the plan will unfairly hurt the poor with a 23% increase in the cost of goods. However, what they don't say is that taxes are responsible for about a quarter of the

price of any good of service. With the taxes eliminated competition would drive base prices down allowing the cost for goods to remain virtually unchanged.

The YRNF National Campaign Blitzes were set up in NJ and VA, two key Gubernatorial election states this year, as well as NY for Mayor Bloomberg and NH for local candidates, many of them YRs. The phones were manned and the literature was dropped for Doug Forrester (NJ) and Jerry Kilgore (VA) by Young Republicans from around the country, who donated their time and experience. The ability to send trained volunteers, such as attorneys and poll watchers, to targeted races is just one of the many things that makes the YRNF a great grassroots organization.

August 27th was set aside as the YRNF National Voter Registration Day. YR clubs across the country took time out to register voters and promote our constitutional right to vote. At the end of the day, a nationwide conference call took place with special guest Governor Huckabee. Participating states phoned in their registration totals prior to the call and the state within each of the

four regions which registered the most voters, spoke on the call, specifically about their success and how it was achieved. This nationwide effort was also picked up by the press in many different media markets, and in the end was a fantastic effort by our YRs.



Our four regions, which make up the YRNF, are the core of our organization's structure. We function through these regions, which makes communicating through the Regional Vice-Chairs quite efficient. Regional meetings and outings are being set up and states within these regions, which are not currently chartered with the YRNF, are being reached out to. Kudos to our Regional Vice-Chairs and Directors for all of their hard work and dedication to the YRNF.

The YRNF overhauled our website, with the main goal being to create a tool and resource for our member clubs, as well as a site to visit for up-to-date information on the goings on of the YRNF. Press releases, news articles, event updates, photos, contact information, links to contribute to and join the YRNF are just some of the features of this new site. States' Updates: Grassroots in Action

Alabama: Participated in the VRD with great success. YR Chad Fincher is running for State House in Mobile Co., seeking to join Rusty Glover, Spencer Collier and Jim Barton as a 4th member of the Mobile YRs to be a State Rep. Rusty is running for the State Senate and Spencer and Jim are running for re-election.

Alaska: Held Convention & Josh Applebee is the new Chairman. Heather Nobrega was re-elected as NCW, and Chris Hawk is the new NCM. They held a fund raiser raising \$10.5K for GOP causes.

Arizona: YRs worked hard to get Republicans elected in city council races for the November election.

California: YRs Held Convention; Catherine Brinkman was re-elected as State Chairman. Vincent Fong is new NCM and Courtney Mayo is new NCW. They also worked very hard to pass ballot propositions on behalf of Governor Schwarzenegger.

Colorado: Worked hard and earned the YRNF Western Region Award for the YRNF Voter Registration Day. They are considering a national meeting bid for the 2007-2009 term, combining work with a ski trip. Their State Convention is this November.

Connecticut: Hosted a kick-off YR event with Cong. Nancy Johnson in July. They also toured the state in an RV to help GOTV for GOP candidates.

DC: Worked on Virginia elections by working phone banks and door-to-door activities with the RNC. Many members participated in legislative or municipal elections in Virginia. They look forward to providing much support for the YRLC in DC April 19-23.

Idaho: Helped host both the President and VP of the US. YRs also held a fundraiser for their NCM who is a State Senator. They also started a monthly business luncheon and will have their State Convention this January.

Illinois: Held Convention Nov. 4th & 5th. Delegates were addressed by gubernatorial candidates & Exec. Dir. of the State GOP. Chairman Rick Veenstra and NCM Dave Carlin were re-elected and Joan Cannon is the new NCW.

Indiana: Gathered in Indianapolis on Sept. 23rd & 24th to re-elect Chairman Glenn Murphy, NCM Jeremy Snelling and NCW Jennifer Mayfield. Delegates heard from party officials on Voter Vault technology and targeted voter registration.

Kansas: Held special election and Liz Rogers is the new NCW. She will serve with Chair Shawn Cowing and NCM Kelly Arnold. They are developing a new brochure & new club development guide, and are growing their membership.

Maine: Held a reorg. meeting where they elected officers. Hopefully Maine will be rechartered in Arkansas.

Maryland: Registered voters at the State Fair, traveled to VA to help with campaigns, hosted a silent auction, and rallied for the troops in DC. MYRs are gearing up for big races next year to re-elect Gov. Ehrlich and elect now Lt. Gov. Michael Steele to Senate.

Massachusetts: Hosted a GOPAC campaign training seminar on Oct. 22. Rick Tyler, Comm. Dir. for Newt Gingrich, lectured.

Michigan: Re-elected Chairman Michael Flory and NCW Alicia Ping. Kris Schimmelpfennig was elected NCM. They are working to institute a Voter Integrity Program for 2006 elections and held a practice run on the Detroit Mayoral race.

Montana: This At-large membership state is working hard to grow their membership base. MT is considering a bid for a national meeting, but will hold off until 2007-2009.

Nebraska: The Omaha Chapter just finished its summer membership drive where over 40 new members joined. First prize for the membership drive went to the University of Nebraska at Omaha Chapter of College Republicans for recruitment of their membership into YRs.

Nevada: Nathan Taylor has resigned from the organization and Jen Baldwin, current NCW, is slated to be Chairman. Western Vice-Chairman Burley is working closely with her to develop a strategy to rebuild the Nevada Fed. into a strong and effective organization.

in Manchester, NH. The NHYRs hosted NH Day on Oct. 29, where YRs came in from across the region to help get out the vote. This extra boost helped to elect a YR candidate for Mayor of Manchester.

New Jersey: Held a GOTV weekend in Union Co. and hosted YRs from PA, CT, and NY to help get out the vote for Doug Forrester and local candidates.

New Mexico: Worked hard and defeated a livability wage increase, in Albuquerque, of more than 2 dollars over the national minimum wage. Also gearing up for next year.

New York: Hosted YRs for a GOTV Blitz week for Mayor Bloomberg. While helping make local campaigns (many being YR candidates) victorious, they've focused on club building, supporting the NJ YRs with Forrester and making the Annual National YR Holiday Party to be held December 17th a success.

Ohio: YRs have been hard at work defeating George Soros! On Nov. 8, four ballot initiatives promoted by outside liberal interest groups to change election law were defeated, thanks in part to YR efforts! Sixteen YRs ran for office in Ohio and many were landslide victories.
