St. Louis, MO - More than 125 Young Republicans participated in over 10 hours of intensive campaign and grassroots training at the YRNF's Midwest Grassroots Leadership Conference in February. Speakers included two-time presidential fundraiser Jack Oliver, John Yob, California political strategist Mark Abernathy, and Roman Buhler, an expert in grassroots organizing. Many attendees said this was one of the best training weekends they had ever attended.

"The goal of the conference was to equip YR leaders for the upcoming campaign year. Everyone in attendance left energized and well prepared to support Republican ideals in the upcoming campaign season!" said YRNF Midwest Regional Vice Chairman Tamara Baker.

At the Saturday night dinner, YRs held a special Valentine's Day straw poll by placing conversation heart candies in the Valentine's bag of their favorite contender. Each attendee was allowed one vote and Senator Sam Brownback (R-KS) edged ahead of Senator John McCain (R-AZ) by 2.5 percent.

for other State YR Organizations and what levels of success can be achieved. They're strong in numbers, committed to our cause and through their actions, continue to do justice for the Young Republican name."

Another staple of the Ohio YRs' successes goes to the mass amounts of volunteer help spread out during the 2004 Bush-Cheney Campaign. As was predicted long ago by NBC's *Meet the Press* host Tim Russert, the election of President Bush came down to three words: "Ohio, Ohio, Ohio." The Ohio Young Republicans were in the thick of the battle of their hotly contested state.

During their Toledo Convention in May of 2004, all participants made phone calls for the President and attended a rally for the Bush-Cheney ticket, where media coverage was heavy. They also organized

support for the Vice President during his debate in Cleveland. During the spring and summer, the Ohio Young Republicans put together a voter registration drive to benefit the campaign. Their members registered voters at gun shows, professional wrestling events, county fairs, and in suburban neighborhoods throughout the state. For their efforts, the Republican National Committee awarded the Ohio YRs the President's Circle Award in recognition of their dedication to voter registration and for their tireless efforts to grow the Republican Party.

In response to the Move-On.org "Vote for Change" tour, the Ohio Young Republicans organized another rally to show support for the President & his policies. At the rally YRs were joined by "Flip-Flop": a giant flip-flop sandal that called attention to John Kerry's ever changing positions.

As election day approached, many members worked as poll watchers, but many other Ohio YRs were charged with organizing and running the "Get Out the Vote PDA Program." In 19 targeted counties, the Ohio Young Republicans recorded who voted on PDAs. This information was used to make phone calls and visits to those who had yet to vote and to track voter turnout. In every one of our targeted counties, President Bush received more votes than he did in 2000.

Whether it's training their local clubs on effective ways to campaign and get out the vote, or working the front lines of the national campaign trail using what they've learned, the Ohio YRs have a rich history and bright future ahead of them.

Alabama: Young Republican Federation of Alabama (YRFA) members are working on the campaigns of many active YRs. The YRFA is fielding candidates for State Senate, State House, State Attorney General and State Auditor.

Alaska: Alaska YRs recently hosted their annual YR Dance and Fundraiser. YRs are planning campaign strategies for the upcoming election cycle in East Anchorage, Fairbanks, Mat-Su, and Peninsula seats, as well as retaining the Governor's mansion. Josh Applebee is Chairman.

California: CYRs are busy campaigning to re-elect Arnold Schwarzenegger, recruiting new members and chartering new clubs. Zack Scrivner, YRNF Vice-Chairman At-Large, is running for re-election to city council, and former YRNF Chairman, Kevin McCarthy, will be running to fill Congressman Bill Thomas' vacated seat. Catherine Brinkman is Chairman.

Colorado: In March, YRs attended neighborhood precinct caucuses. As one of the few states who still use the Caucus system, this was a great opportunity for YRs to participate at the grassroots level and to work to take back the state legislature and put it in the "Right" hands. YRs are also in the process of chartering a new club. Jay Klinkerman is Chairman.

Connecticut: Connecticut Young Republicans have held regional socials in an effort to increase membership throughout the state. YRs are excited to work this Fall to re-elect mentor Congresswoman Nancy Johnson. The next statewide YR meeting is this Spring. Jerry Schwab is Chairman.

Florida: The Florida Federation of Young Republicans (FFYR) hosted their Annual Alumni Reagan Day Dinner in Orlando. The Spring quarterly was held March 30th – April 1st, with a great series of events; a meeting with Governor Jeb Bush, tour of

the Governor's mansion, lunch with Commissioner of Agriculture Bronson, dinner with a Senator Fasano, along with meeting proceedings which were held in the House Chambers. Jon Woodward is Chairman.
